## Action day 8. Sep. 24: Our Görli remains open!


The Berlin Senate has decided to rebuild Görlitzer Park and close it at night (and possibly also during the day). The measures in detail:

- Lockable gates and turnstiles at all entrances (including two massive gates on the bridge over the canal)
- Partial replacement of the existing wall with fences, new fences where there are none
- 40 new floodlights distributed on high masts across the park
- Extensive clear-cutting in the park, removal of many bushes and shrubs

Over two million euros are to be spent on these measures. A further almost one million a year is to be spent on guarding the closed Görli. At the same time, massive cuts are being made to social measures and projects.

The planned closure of Görli does not solve any of the existing problems (e.g. racist exclusion, lack of affordable housing, inadequate services for drug users, increasing poverty, exclusion from the healthcare system). Instead, the Görli will be taken away from us all for racist and populist reasons.

We are determined to work together to prevent the planned closure of Görli and other measures such as large-scale clear-cutting in the park. At our day of action on September 8, we want to take a playful approach to various ways of sabotaging the Senate's plans and once again make the broad, diverse resistance to the Görli closure visible.
